Dear Parent / Carers,

Re: Pupil Premium Funding

This letter is to confirm that your child is currently eligible for Pupil Premium Funding. I would like to take this opportunity to explain how the funding the school receives for your child is used.

The school also has a Pupil Premium Strategy, which can be found on the school website. If you wish to request a paper copy, please let the School Office know. This outlines the steps that the school takes to ensure that children receiving Pupil Premium Funding make good progress both academically and personally.

Money received for Pupil Premium is not ring fenced for each child. It is used to invest in resources and learning programmes, which are delivered to whole classes as part of the 'High Quality First Teaching' approach. This ensures that all children receive an excellent education. This will in turn support your child in making progress.

The school strongly believes that children's emotional well-being is vitally important for success. Funding is also used in providing pastoral care for children in ways such as training for all school staff. This means that all classrooms are a safe and nurturing place in which to be. A member of staff is also employed solely for this purpose and children receive support in small groups or as a 1:1. This can be a regular intervention or on a more ad hoc basis, as and when children need this help.

You will be aware that the school does also use the money to support children in other ways, which are probably more noticeable to you. This may be helping to provide school uniform or paying for enrichment activities such as clubs or school trips. As the funding is used in a wider context, there will be occasions where we are not able to agree to use money to pay for activities or other opportunities. We would like to add that the Pupil Premium funding pot is limited to what the school receives, we will be keeping a yearly expenditure account for all Pupil Premium children. However, you should be reassured that the way that the funding is used in our school will mean that your child continues to have the best possible education and make the most progress they can.

Below are the approximate amounts of the annual cost for each intervention or support that may be made available to children, per pupil. This enables us to track our Pupil Premium spend to make it fair for all children who access these provisions.



Morning Maths	£192
Breakfast Club	£80
Homework Club	£240
Uniform (PE kit and School Uniform) – please contact the school office for more details, this includes a pencil case	£64



School swimming lessons – relates to Year 5 pupils	£80
School trips and visits	£112
Residential Trips – we will make available £240 per pupil premium child to go towards a residential trip, this is for Year 6 in 25/26; Charging & Remissions Policy apply in all cases	£240
School Workshops, such as Greek Day, Authors visit	£32
Teaching cover for termly progress meetings	£80
Mentoring	£48
One paid for School Club, unfortunately this does not include music lessons	£192
